



Admission requirements - Applying directly from high school

Applicants need a minimum average of 70% with no individual mark below 60% in the five senior-level courses listed below (or equivalent). Visit **smu.ca/admissions** to see our competitive recognition for advanced studies, including IB, AP, A Level and CAPE.



ARTS

English and four other academic courses



ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES

English and four other academic courses



BUSINESS (COMMERCE)

English, Mathematics*, and three other academic courses



SCIENCE

Accepted science courses: Biology, Physics, Chemistry, Computer Programming

English, Pre-Calculus*, one academic science course and two other academic courses



DIPLOMA IN ENGINEERING

English, Pre-Calculus, Chemistry, one academic Science course (Physics recommended but not required) and one other academic course.

Early admission

Early admission is available to students who have completed grade 11 and have registered for, but not yet completed, their first semester of grade 12 courses. Early admission opens in August and goes until the end of January (or until your final first semester marks are available). Review of applications begins in October.

English Proficiency Requirements for International Students

If English is not your first language, you may need to provide your scores with an English language proficiency test:

- IELTS Academic: minimum score of 6.5 with no individual score below 6.0
- TOEFL iBT: minimum score of 83 overall with no score below 20
- Duolingo English Test (DET): score of 115 with no sub-score below 95
- Completion of university preparatory English at a Languages Canada accredited school recognized by Saint Mary's
- · Nova Scotia International Student Program (NSISP) and other provincial equivalencies with a 70% in Grade 12 English



Entrance Scholarships

Students who apply for the September intake before **February 15** will be assessed for entrance scholarships. Selection is competitive and based on academic merit. Learn more at **smu.ca/scholarships**
