

The Department of Criminology at Saint Mary's University invites applications for an eight month contractually limited term appointment at the rank of Assistant Professor to commence September 1, 2020.

We are seeking a criminologist with a demonstrated capacity to teach courses in areas related to victimology/victims and criminal justice, sexual/gender-based violence, policing, restorative justice and/or quantitative methods.

The successful candidate must hold a PhD (or be ABD and close to the completion of a PhD) in Criminology or a related discipline. Candidates must provide evidence of a strong research record and show promise of a high standard of teaching.

Applications must consist of the following items only: 1) a cover letter indicating potential teaching areas, 2) a curriculum vitae, 3) copies of graduate school transcripts, and 4) the names and contact information for three referees. Please merge these documents into a single PDF file.
