

Access Services

One of our most highprofile services, this department continues to look for ways to improve its relationships with the University's students and faculty.

Among its many achievements this past year:

- Employed 21 SMU students.
- Investigated text books on reserves with SMUSA executive.
- First time IDs were created in the Library classroom on family day.
- Worked with SMUSA to host and support wellness events during exams.
- Partnered with SMUSA to throw the first ever Student Appreciation Day.
- Study rooms were booked 16,851 times.
- Introduced a paging service to retrieve items from the stacks.
 We retrieved 695 items.
- Conducted an Inventory of the collection.

Active on Campus and in the Community

Amy Lorencz spoke on a panel about management practices at the Dalhousie School of Information Management (SIM).

Hansel Cook finished an eight-month sabbatical researching immigrant archives and presented his results at the Association of Canadian Archivists conference in Ottawa, and the Council of Nova Scotia Archives conference in Halifax.

We answered 5,388 research help questions this year!




Services and Accolades


We welcomed:
