

**Two Tenure Track Positions in the Management Science area**  
**Department of Finance, Information Systems, and Management Science**

The Sobey School of Business at Saint Mary's University invites applications for two tenure-track positions in Management Science at the rank of assistant or associate professor. The anticipated starting date is July 1, 2020.

Criteria for the position are:

1. Candidate should have a Ph.D. or ABD in one of Operations Management, Management Science, Health Care Analytics, or related areas.
2. Preferred Specializations: The first priority is Data Analytics (with application in key functional areas such as supply chain management, health systems, sustainability management, service management, and retail management). Specializations in other areas may be considered.
3. Ability and willingness to teach in at least two of core subject areas offered by the Management Science Group in the Undergraduate and Graduate Programs (Data Analytics, Management Science, and Operations Management).
4. Openness to innovation in pedagogical approaches (active learning, problem-based learning, case method, use of technology, blended learning, flipped classroom, ....).
5. Potential to add value to one or several of the graduate programs offered by the Sobey School of Business, ( (a) the MBA Program, (b) the Executive MBA Program, (c) the Masters of Finance, and (d) the Masters in Technology, Entrepreneurship and Innovation) and contribute to the development of new programs.
6. Ability to build research and education connections with other areas (disciplines, programs, departments) of the Sobey School of Business and of Saint Mary's University.
