Experience and Education Requirements

We seek a critically engaged scholar, practitioner, educator, or researcher who self-identifies as Black or Indigenous.

The successful candidate should have:

- an advanced degree in Criminology or a related discipline, including but not limited to an MSW or LLM;
- demonstrate an ability to teach courses in their areas of expertise;
- and commit to promoting an inclusive and equitable learning environment for our diverse student body.

The successful candidate should demonstrate at least one of the following:

- experience working with Indigenous or Black communities; teaching (which can entail delivering community-centred learning or mentorship);
- conducting research (which can entail community-based forms of information gathering and analysis);
- or authorship of scholarly or other types of publications.

Application Details

Recognizing the underrepresentation of Black and Indigenous faculty at Saint Mary's University, this position is open only to qualified individuals who self-identify as Black or Indigenous, First Nations, Inuit, or Métis.

Applicants should submit an application package consisting of the following six items only, *merged into one PDF*:

1. a letter of application addressing the criteria laid out above;
2. a curriculum vitae;
3. one example of recent publication or other writing;
4. unofficial graduate/post-graduate transcripts;
5. the names and contact information for three referees;
6. a university-level course syllabus you have developed and taught or a draft or mock syllabus of a course you can teach in your area of experience or expertise.

We will begin considering applications on January 30, 2024, until the position is filled.
