Course: LING 2309.1 Phonetics

Academic Calendar Description: This course is an introduction to the production, acoustic properties, and perception of the sounds used in English and other languages. Skills developed include: systematic transcription of speech sounds using the International Phonetic Alphabet, description of sounds in articulatory terms, and recognition of linguistically relevant properties of sounds from spectrograms and waveforms.

Prerequisite: LING 1200 (Introduction to Linguistics)

Qualifications: Applicants must have a Ph.D. completed or near completion in linguistics or a closely related field, and experience teaching linguistics at the undergraduate level. The preferred applicant will have a demonstrated ability to teach in the specific area of phonetics, either through previous experience of teaching phonetics or through teaching experience in another subfield of linguistics combined with expertise in phonetics as a researcher.

Duties: Duties and responsibilities include preparation and delivery of lectures, preparation and evaluation of all student assessments, and holding regular office hours during the term.

Remuneration: Remuneration is in accordance with the Collective Agreement between Saint Mary's University and CUPE 3912.

How to Apply: Applications are invited in the first instance from part-time faculty colleagues on the Saint Mary's precedence list. Applicants who currently hold a part-time teaching appointment at Saint Mary's University should submit a cover letter and a c.v. Applicants who do not currently hold a part-time teaching appointment at Saint Mary's University should submit a complete application (including a cover letter, c.v., proof of academic credentials, names and contact information of three referees, and any evidence of teaching effectiveness).
